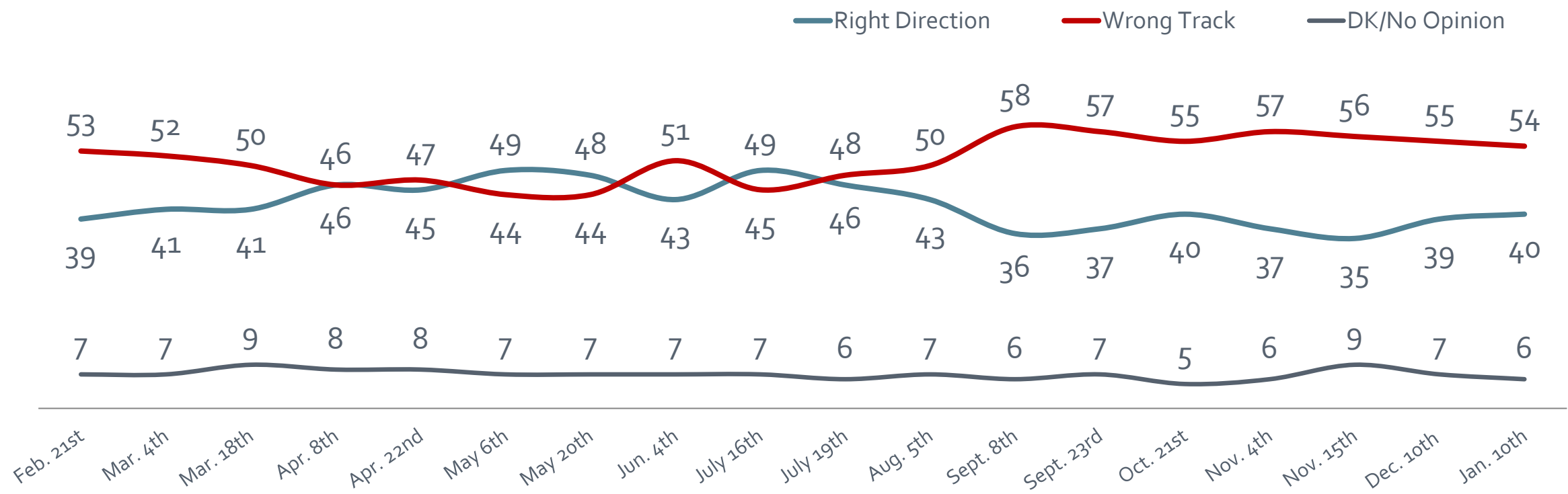

MOST CONCERNING ISSUE

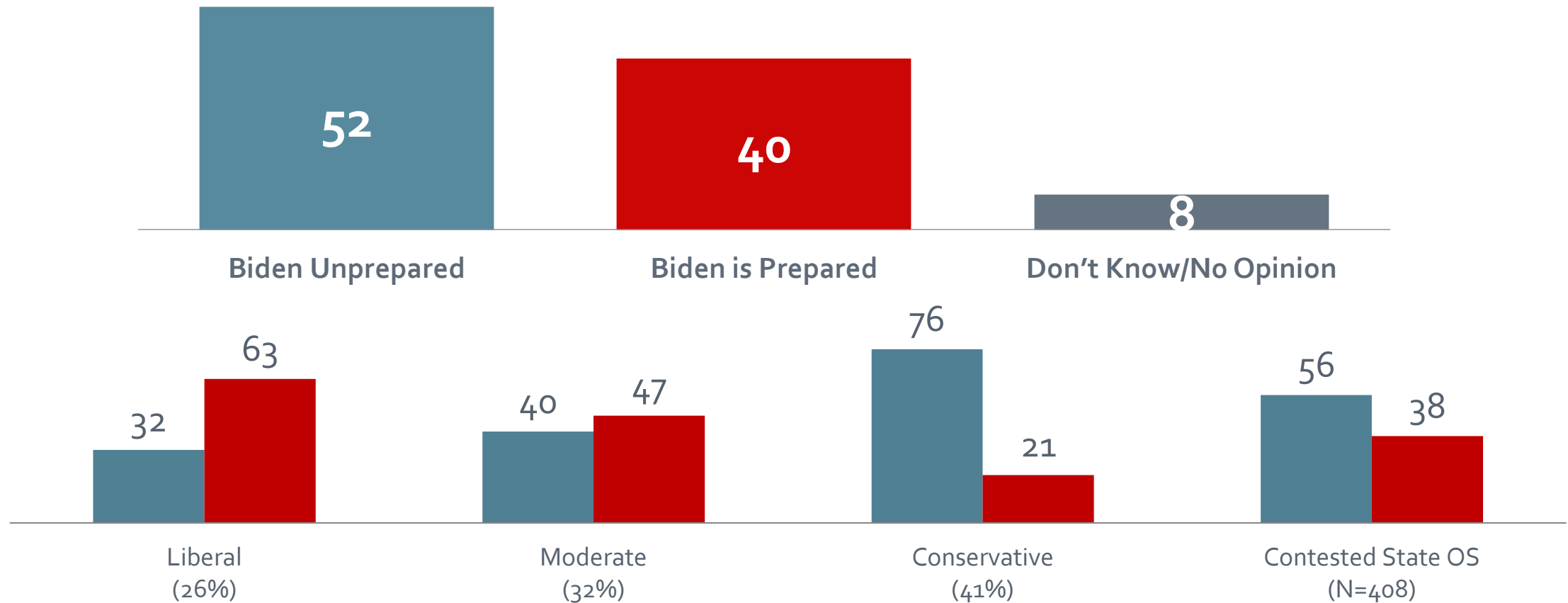
*RESPONDENTS CHOSE UP TO 3 ISSUES

Joe Biden and the federal government have done everything possible to combat COVID, and these negative outcomes are beyond their control.

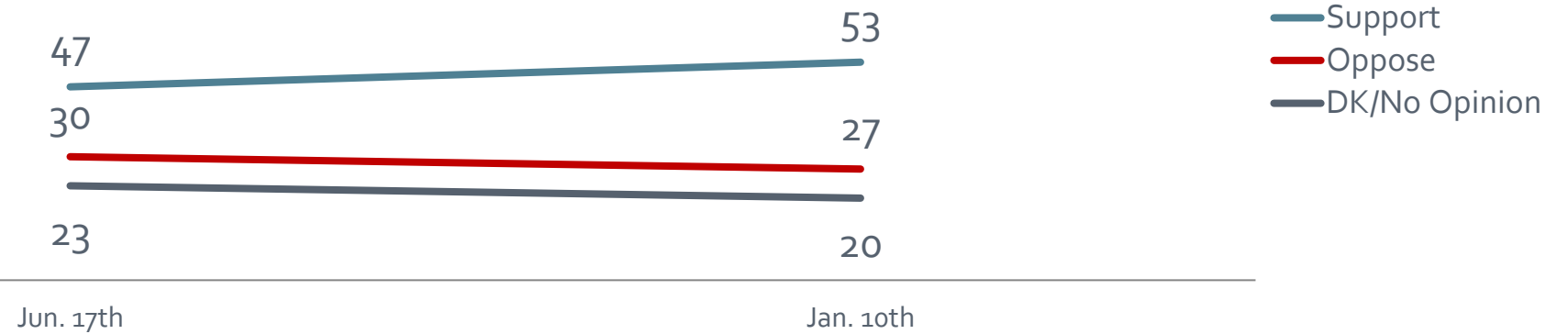




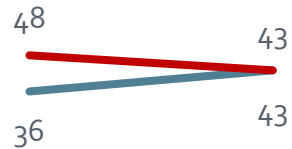
THE FILIBUSTER

FILIBUSTER SUPPORT

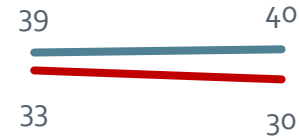
The “Filibuster” is a rule in the Senate that requires most legislation to have 60 Votes (60% of the 100 seats currently in the Senate) rather than a bare majority of 51. Supporters of the Filibuster say this rule protects the voice of the minority and encourages compromise which is good for the country. Opponents of the Filibuster say this rule is a racist Jim Crow relic that allows the Republican minority to block popular legislation the country needs. 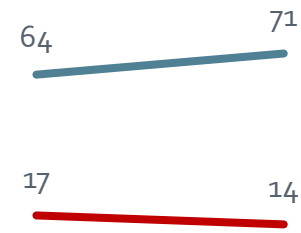

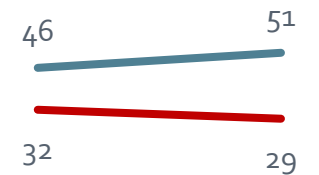

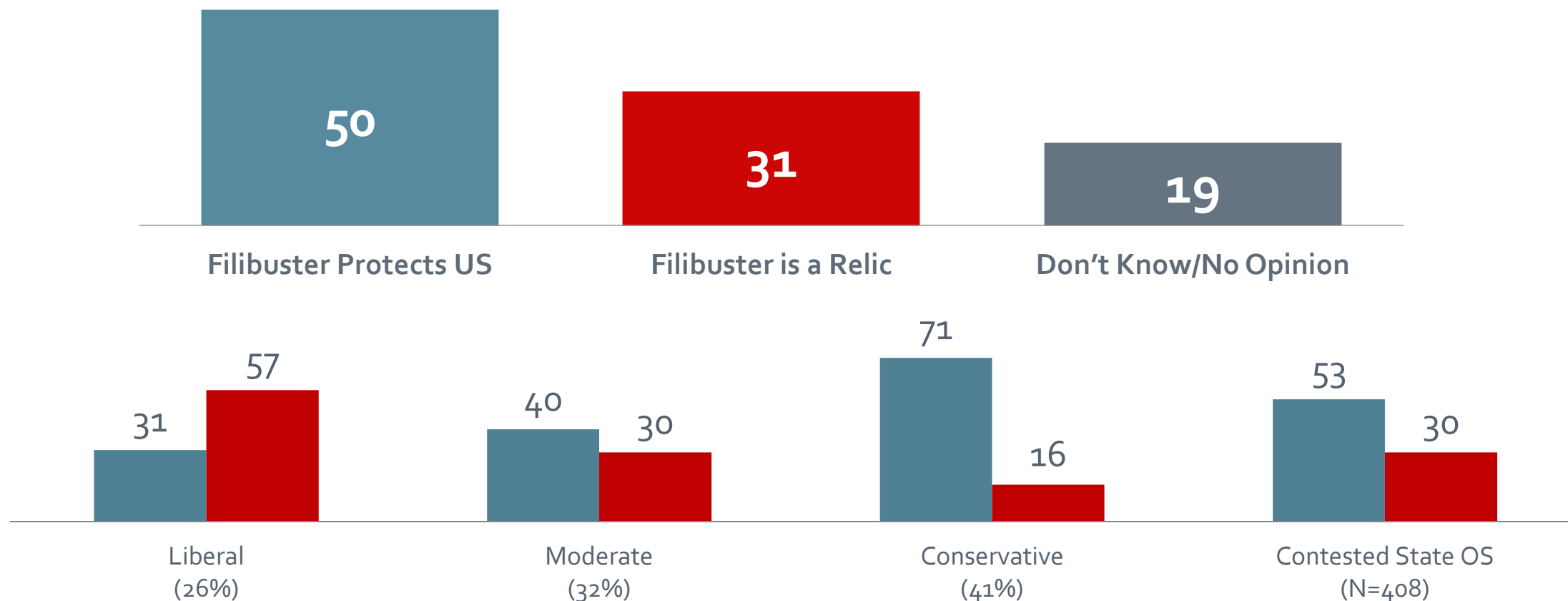

Next are some statements made by public figures about this filibuster debate. Please read each one carefully and indicate if you agree or disagree with each statement.

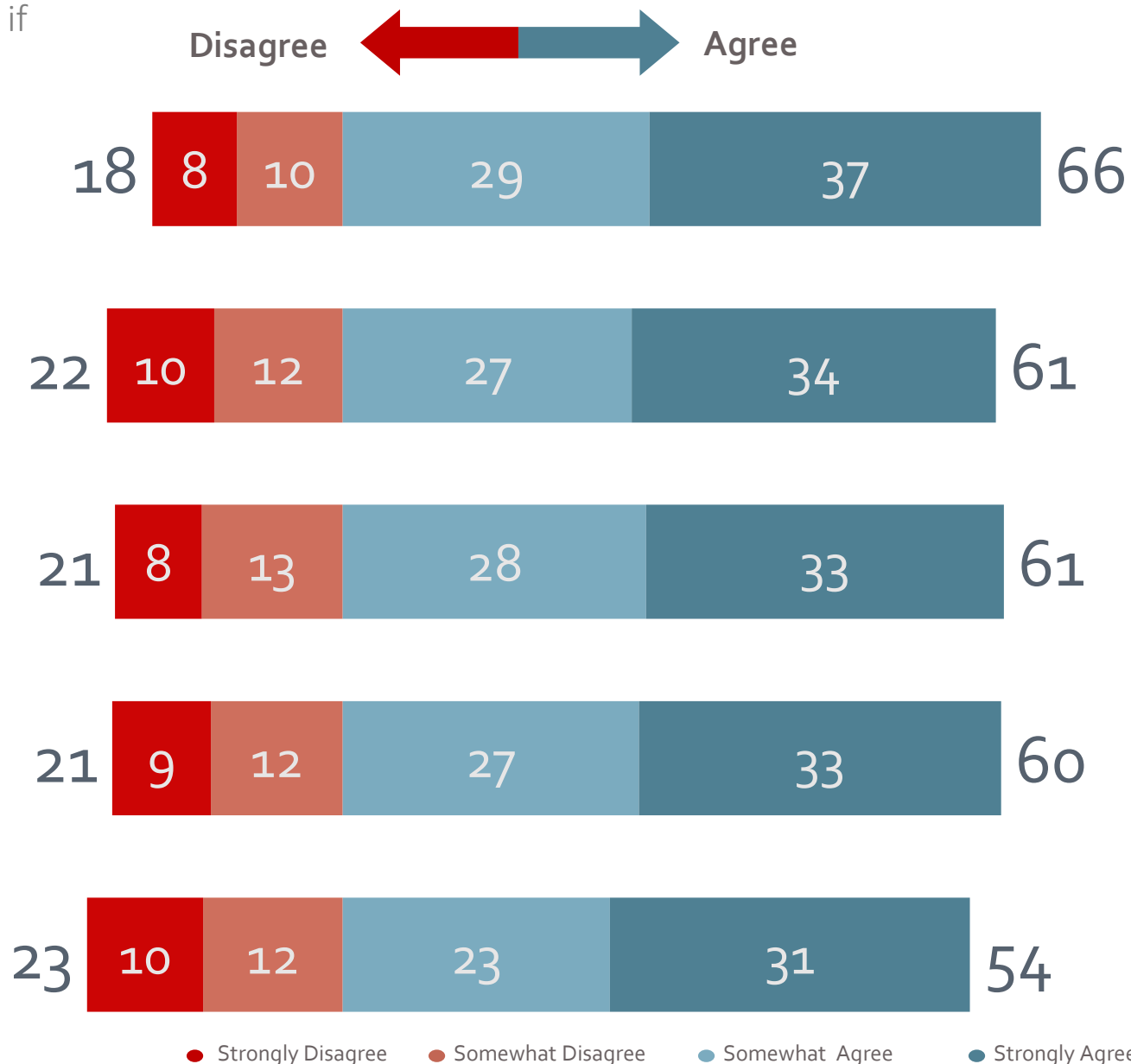
The possibility of one-party rule, with no rights for the minority party, is anti-democratic and should be rejected out of hand.

The focus on Senate procedural fights, like the filibuster, is a distraction from the real work the Senate should be doing on priorities like COVID, Inflation, and Immigration. It is time for Democrats to move on from this pipe dream and start doing the hard work which will actually help Americans.

The filibuster is a valuable tool in the Senate because it forces both parties to come to the table and compromise on any legislation that may become the law of the land.

The filibuster must be preserved to protect America from radical agendas from EITHER Republicans or Democrats. Any proposed law, from either party, that cannot get at least 60 votes should not become law.

Democrats are engaged in supreme political hypocrisy. Senator Schumer regularly argued in favor of the filibuster when he was in the minority, 32 Democrat Senators signed an open letter in 2017 defending the filibuster (when Trump was President), and Democrats used the practice hundreds of times to block Republican priorities from becoming law.
