From what you have heard about the new Republican House majority, do you personally support or oppose their agenda?





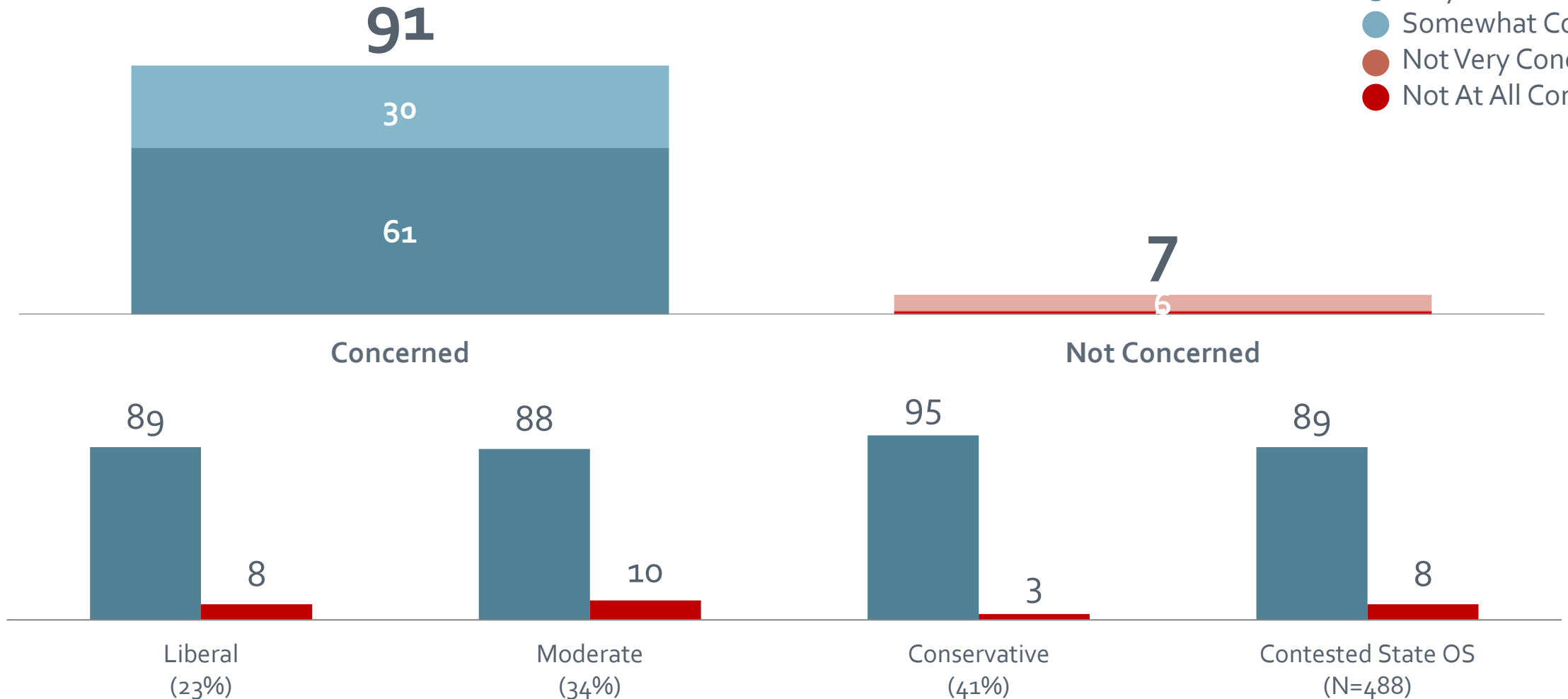

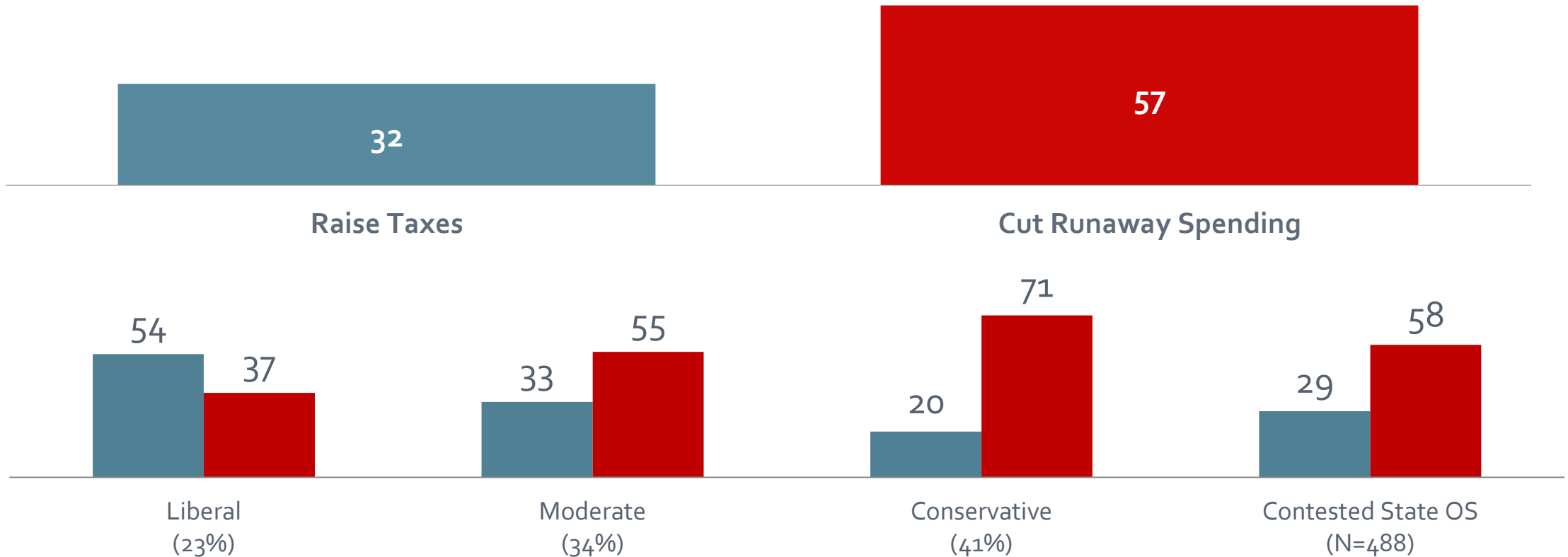


# FEDERAL BUDGET SOLUTIONS

Others say that Congress should cut back on runaway federal spending and implement tax policies that support economic growth.

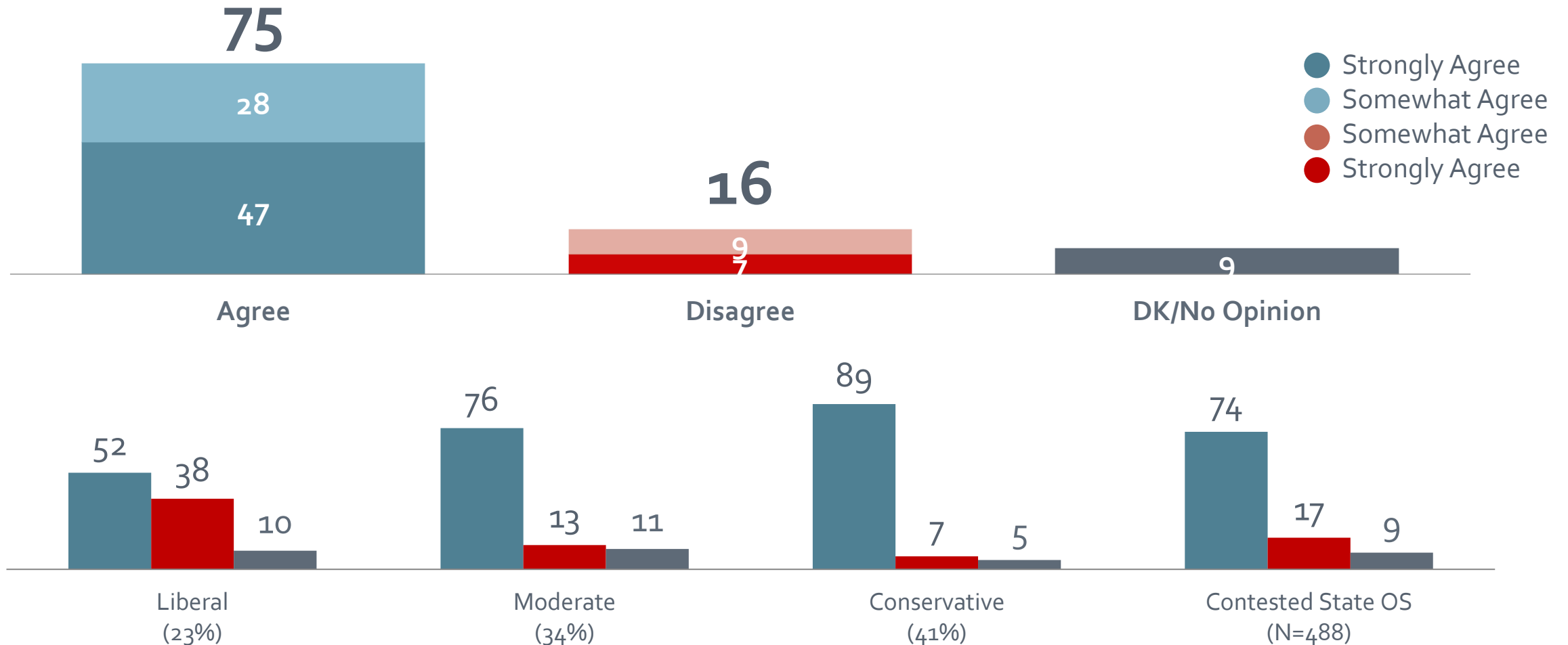

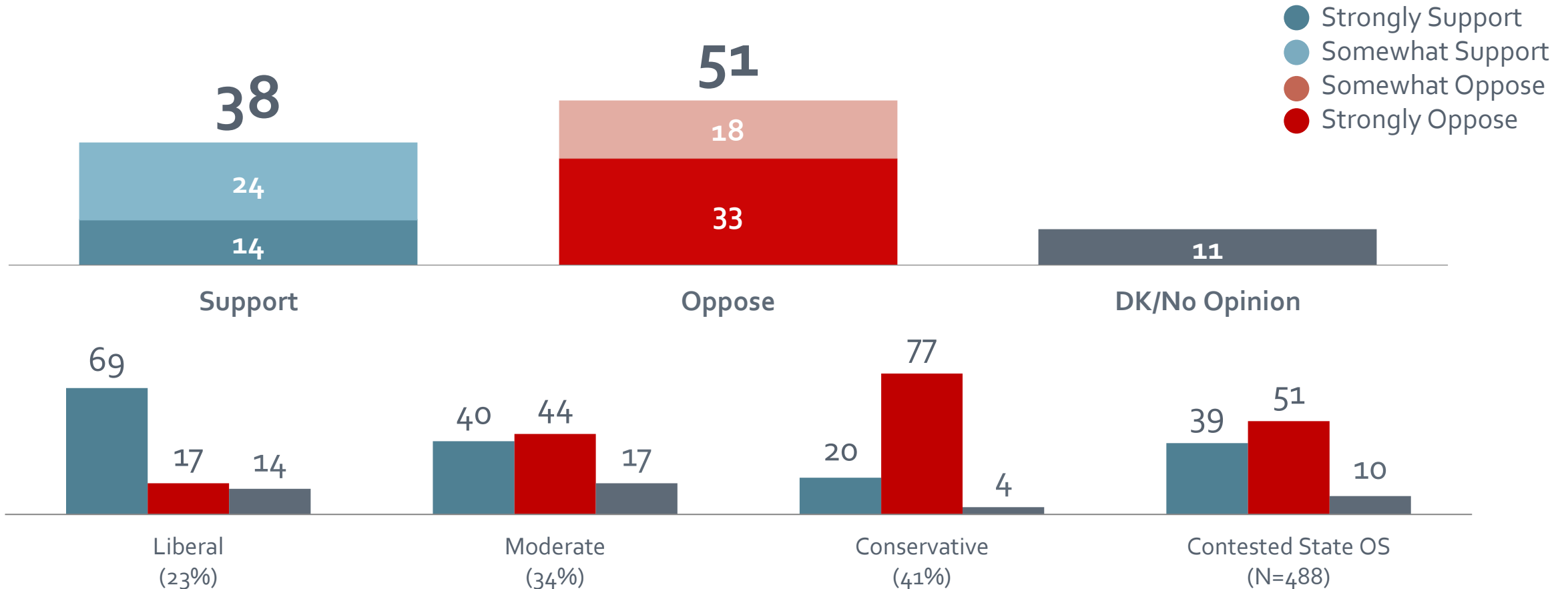

Do you support or oppose how President Biden and his administration has handled our relationship with China?



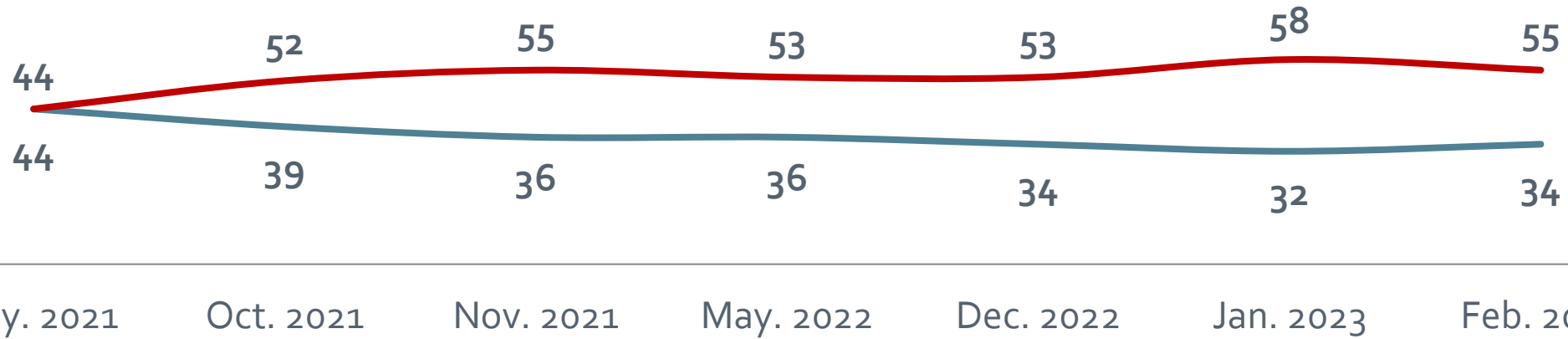

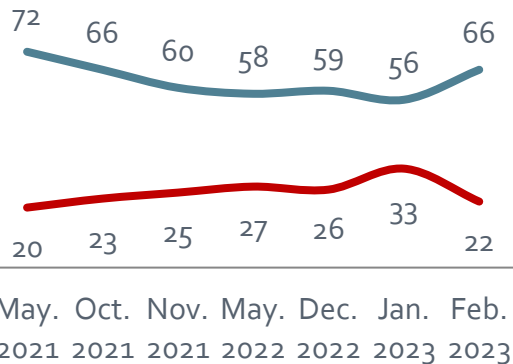

Thinking about the job that Joe Biden has done with regards to Immigration & the Southern Border, would you say you approve or disapprove of the job he has done?

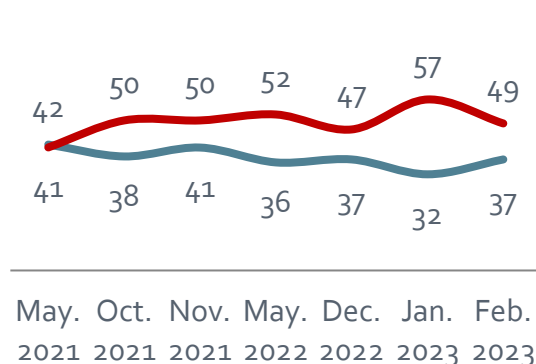

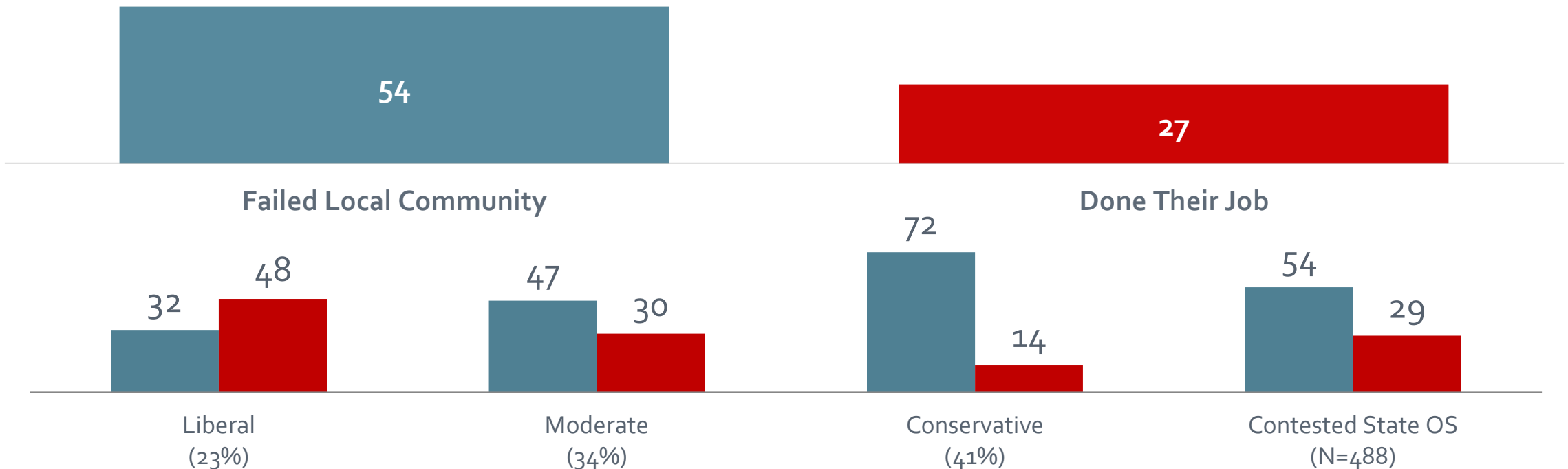




Thinking again about the Ohio train derailment, which of the following do you most agree with, even if neither is exactly correct?

Others say that the Environmental Protection Agency and the Biden Administration have competently done their job in helping the local community by working to hold the railroad company accountable for the accident.

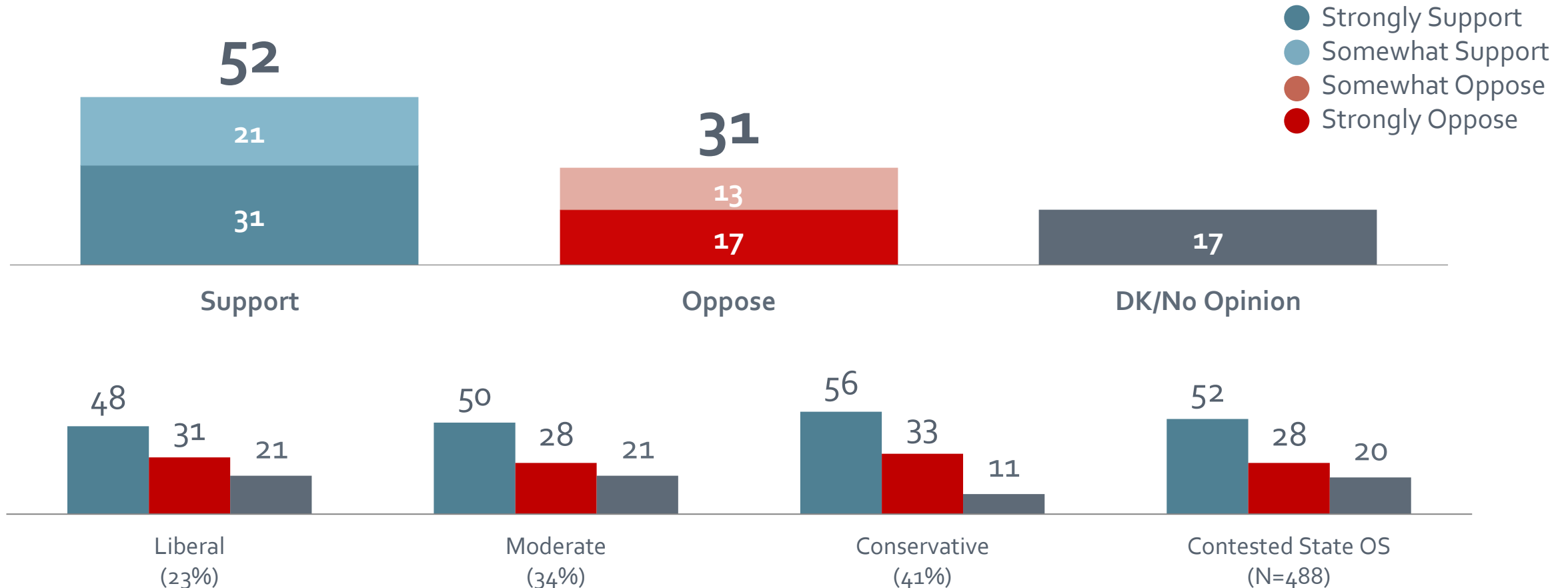
